Provide Input on National Commercial Building Data Needs

National Institute of Building Sciences (NIBS) Plans Hearing for July 18th

In response to recent news that the Energy Information Administration (EIA) will not release the results of its 2007 Commercial Building Energy Consumption Survey (CBECS) or complete its 2011 Survey, CBC Steering Committee member, the National Institute of Building Sciences (NIBS) is holding a hearing on Monday, July 18, 2011 in Washington, D.C., to gather input from building industry participants about the industry's commercial building data needs. Organizations can provide their input on current and anticipated data needs, existing sources of data and potential future data sources.

To facilitate a thorough discussion, sectors of the building community have been grouped into sessions. Actual session times will be determined by the level of interest in presenting at the hearing.

1. Building Owners/Facility Managers/Commissioning
2. Government (Policy/Regulatory/Voluntary)
3. Architects/Engineers/Contractors/Specifiers
4. Insurance & Finance
5. Codes & Standards/Rating Systems
6. Software Vendors and Manufacturers
